

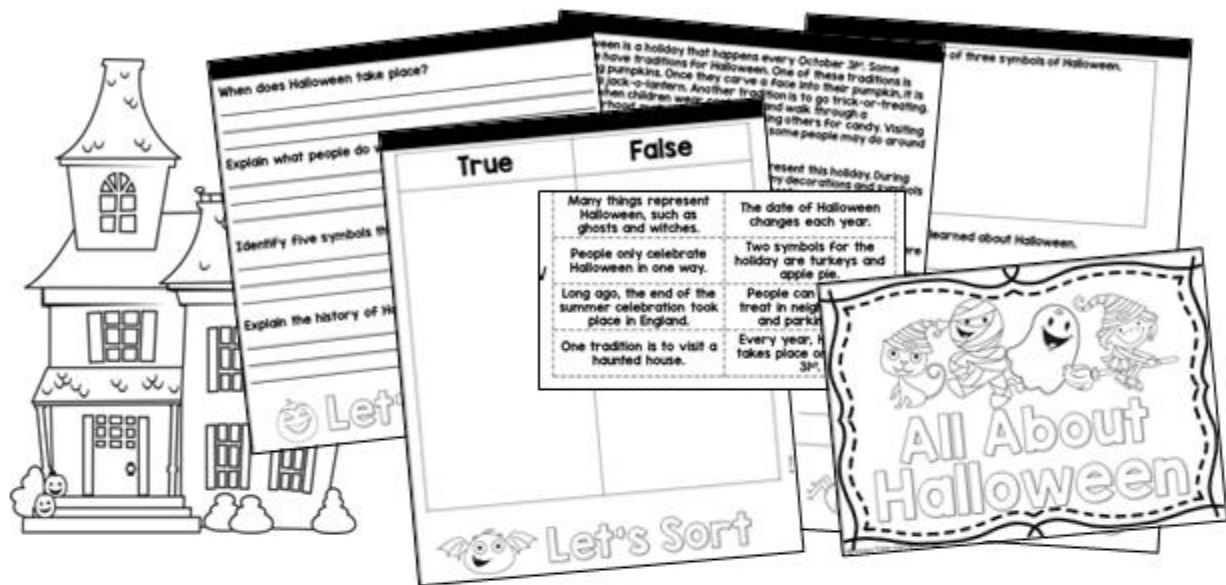
Halloween Flip Book



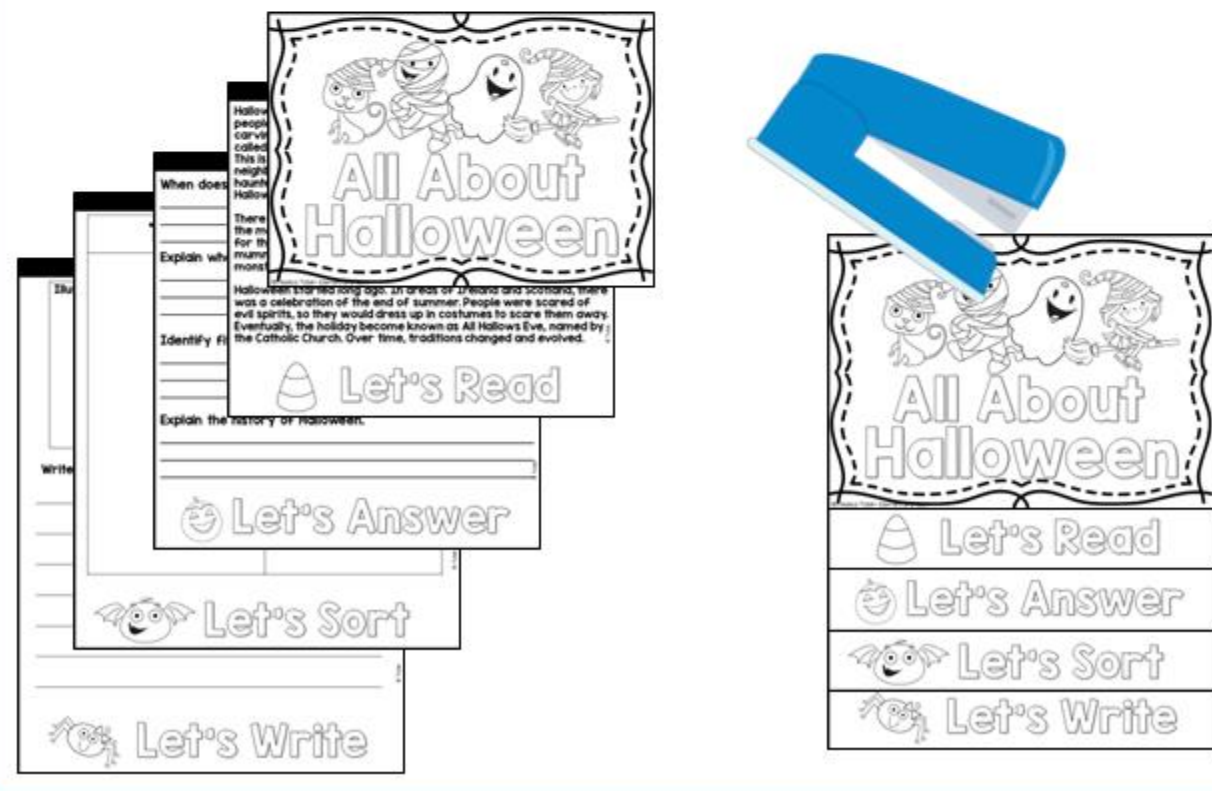

Halloween is a holiday that happens every October 31st. Some people have traditions for Halloween. One of these traditions is carving pumpkins. Once they carve a face into their pumpkin, it is called a jack-o-lantern. Another tradition is to go trick-or-treating. This is when children wear costumes and go door-to-door in their neighborhood, mall, or parking lot. They ask for candy. Visiting haunted houses is also a tradition. Some people may do around Halloween.

There are many symbols for Halloween. One symbol is pumpkins. During the month of October, people carve pumpkins into jack-o-lanterns. For the holiday, people wear costumes and masks. Other symbols are ghosts, witches, and mummy dolls.

Halloween started in 800 A.D. In areas of Ireland and Scotland, there was a celebration of the end of summer. People were scared of evil spirits, so they would dress up in costumes to scare them away. Eventually, the holiday became known as All Hallows' Eve, named by the Catholic Church. Over time, traditions changed and evolved.
