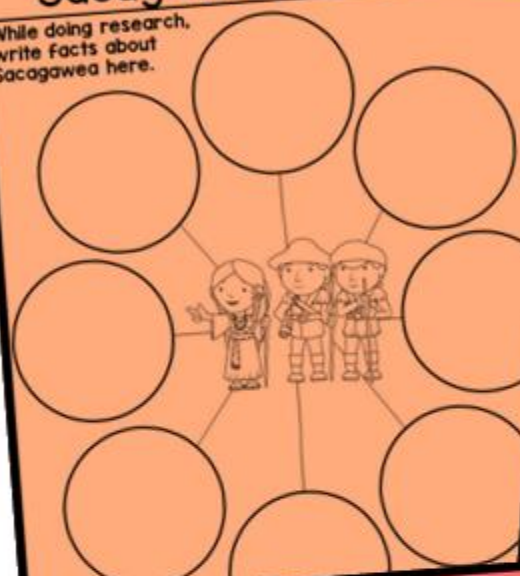

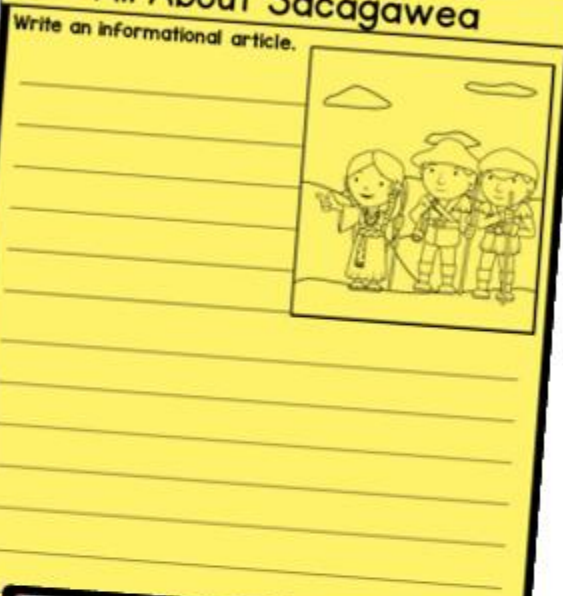

Sacagawea was born as a Shoshone Native American in Idaho in 1788. Lewis and Clark came through North Dakota on their expedition to claim western lands for America in 1804. When they met Sacagawea, they invited her to join the expedition as an interpreter. She gave birth to her son shortly after joining the expedition. When they had trouble crossing a river, she rescued important journals for Lewis and Clark. Sacagawea later helped in negotiations with Native Americans. She helped them on their long, hard journey to find western lands. She taught them things on the journey, too. Unfortunately, little is known about her life after her expedition.

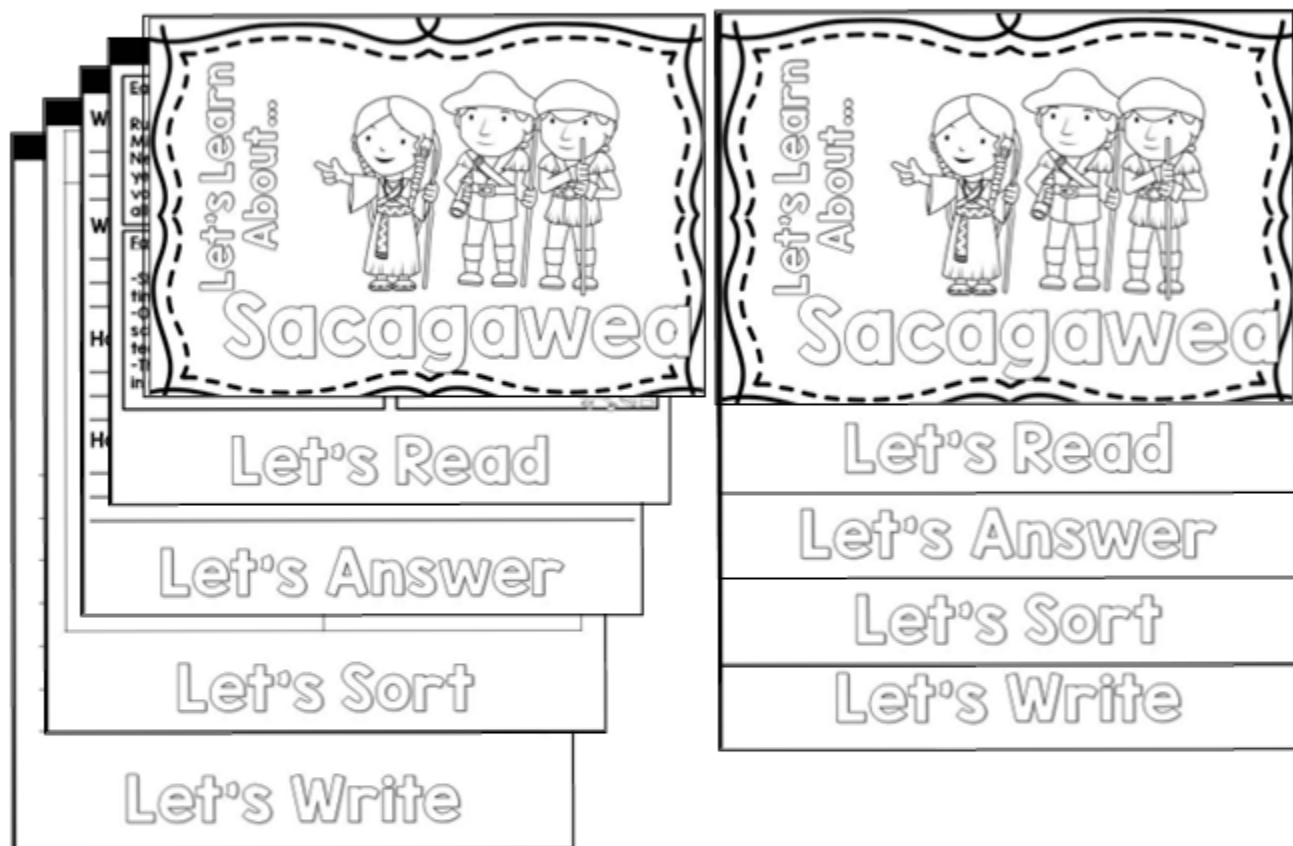
